Dr. Dale Henry

After earning his B.S. and M.S. in Secondary Education, Dale Henry completed his Ph.D. in 1991 with a consideration in the area of Adult and Continuing Education. He has served as an educator. In 1994, he was appointed Associate Dean of Professional and Graduate Studies for Tennessee's oldest college, Tusculum College in Greeneville, Tennessee.

Dale Henry is the founder and president of Your Best Unlimited, Inc., a Tennessee based training company and a native of East Tennessee and the foothills of the Smoky Mountains.

Second Harvest Food Bank of East Tennessee

Second Harvest Food Bank provides food for 4,000,000 meals a year. This food helps more than 160,000 people that suffer from hunger in our community.

Second Harvest distributes food to more than 350 non-profit agencies in 18 East Tennessee counties. These agencies include soup kitchens, homeless shelters, domestic violence centers, drug abuse clinics, battered women's shelters, neighborhood churches, schools, youth program facilities, and food pantries.

Second Harvest supports its programs directly with 92% of every dollar donated. The remaining amount is split with 3% going to administration expense and 5% going to fund raising. For every dollar donated, Second Harvest can feed two people a meal.

Lee is a Respiratory Therapist at Methodist Medical Center (MMC) on union leave as an organizer for Services Employees International Union, Local 205. In her spare time, she is a soprano with the Appalachian Harmonizers. Rickey is the Labor Relations Program Manager at MMC and a former pianist with the McKameys.
